**Two Adults, Two Juveniles Arrested for Burglarizing Cars in
Warren Township**

During the overnight hours of October 29-October 30, 2018, 18 burglaries to vehicles were reported in the Grandwood Park area (Warren Township). Sheriff's Deputies responded and commenced an immediate investigation.

During the investigation, Sheriff's Deputies learned the suspects in the car burglaries were staying at a motel in the 600 block of North Green Bay Road, Waukegan. Sheriff's Deputies and Detectives located a vehicle used by the suspects in the motel parking lot. After conducting surveillance at the motel, two adults and two juveniles were taken into custody in the afternoon on October 30th. They were found to be in possession of proceeds stolen during the vehicle burglaries.

Jevon D. Anderson, 18, of the 11100 block of South Homewood Avenue, Chicago, was charged with:
Aggravated Identity Theft (Class 3 Felony)
Identity Theft (Class 4 Felony)
Receiving Lost/Mislaid Credit Cards (Class 4 Felony)
Anderson remains held in the Lake County Jail on \$20,000.00 bail. His next court date is November 2, 2018, at 1:30PM in courtroom T110.

Kevion A. Minor, 20, of the 400 block of East 90th Street, Chicago, was charged with:
Aggravated Identity Theft (Class 3 Felony)
Identity Theft (Class 4 Felony)
Receiving Lost/Mislaid Credit Cards (Class 4 Felony)
Theft (Class A Misdemeanor)
Minor remains held in the Lake County Jail on \$25,000.00 bail. His next court date is November 5, 2018, at 1:30PM in courtroom T110.

Charges are pending against the two juveniles taken into custody.

Sheriff Mark Curran said, “Always remember to remove valuables from your vehicle, lock your car doors, and remove spare keys/key fobs. Report any suspicious activity by calling 911.”

The investigation continues, and additional charges are possible.

Sheriff Curran reminds the public the defendants are presumed innocent unless proven guilty in a court of law.
